Buffalo High School offers regionally unmatched opportunities in academics, arts and activities. More than 1,700 students in grades 9-12 consistently outpace state averages thanks to challenging courses, abundant extracurricular choices and the cultivation of a caring atmosphere where students can dream, believe and achieve.

In annual surveys, our students overwhelmingly say that BHS has prepared them well for the future. Buffalo High School combines a small-school feel with big-school opportunities. Our school community's core values are to "Be Kind, Proud, Driven Leaders" in all that we do.

Be Kind

Surveys consistently indicate that our students feel supported by staff, and also by fellow students. In all, 92% of our students say they have an adult at school they can go to if they have a problem (national average: 54%). In addition, 82% of students say they feel supported by other students at school (national average: 33%). Our students build positive relationships in many ways. One example is our state-leading Unified Program, which builds friendships and common experiences among students with and without disabilities.

Be Proud

BHS students and staff can rightly take pride in their school. BHS regularly boasts outstanding academic successes, state-of-the-art athletic facilities and competitive teams, and award-winning music and theater programs. BHS is home to nationally recognized FFA and journalism programs, and perennial state-level Knowledge Bowl, Mock Trial and BPA clubs.

Be Driven

Students have every opportunity to strive for high performance in the classroom, where there are about 40 College in the Schools and Advanced Placement courses; in the arts, where some of the state's top teachers guide well-regarded music and theater programs; and on the playing field or in the activity realm, where BHS students compete with the best in the state and nation.



The success of every student is important to us at BHS. We use what we call Bison Academic Support and Enrichment (BASE) time and increased advisory services to help support our students throughout their time here in special classes that take place during the school day.

Advisory (Monday and Friday)

Provides a balanced look at life after high school with lessons focused on college/career readiness, academic support and planning, and social skills.

• BASE (Tuesday-Thursday)

Students choose how they would like to spend their time, with options

like homework help, test make-up, enrichment opportunities and more.

Unified Programming

Excellence in the Arts

An award-winning arts department features more musical options than most schools in the area, including band, choir and orchestra, and has produced numerous allstate performers. In 2023-24, BHS band director Scott Rabehl was named the High School Music Educator of the Year by the Minnesota Music Educators Association. In addition, the theatre program has a tradition of excellence and offers numerous opportunities for students to build a wide variety of skills.

A Wealth of Extracurricular Activities

Buffalo High School has outstanding athletic and activity facilities. Community members and students show their Bison pride by turning out in large numbers for sports and other school events.

BHS students compete in the Lake Conference, sharing athletic and activity schedules with Edina, Eden Prairie, Hopkins, Minnetonka, St. Michael-Albertville and Wayzata. The Lake Conference is widely considered the highest-profile, most competitive conference in the state of Minnesota. Since joining, our students have proven that they can compete at the highest levels across a wide spectrum of sports and activities. This competition challenges our students and staff to reach performance levels beyond their individual expectations.





Giving Students a Head Start in Career and College Readiness

BHS offers nearly 40 tuition-free College in the Schools (CIS) courses, more than double any other school in Wright County or the Lake Conference. Simply put, our students are well prepared for college and career because they have regionally unmatched opportunities to engage with advanced courses in a wide variety of fields, from technical and agricultural topics to mathematics, science and more.

More than 83% of the Class of 2024 left BHS with credits on a college transcript, having learned from trained and credentialed BHS teachers who can offer a supportive environment with college-level rigor.

Without sacrificing the high school experience, BHS students can earn from 1 to 5 college credits per course that will transfer to any Minnesota State college or university, and to many other schools in and out of the state. See mntransfer.org.



Advanced Placement

In addition to CIS courses, BHS also offers Advanced Placement (AP) classes in Calculus, Biology and Computer Science. AP classes help students sharpen collegelevel skills and study habits, and provide an opportunity to test for college credit. The test score and accepting college determine the number of credits a student will earn.

Number of Students Taking CIS Courses



More than 83% of 2024 graduates earned college credit during high school. In 2023-24, students earned 5,454 college credits, saving families more than \$1.8 MILLION!

An Alternative High School Option

Phoenix Learning Center

Phoenix Learning Center, located within Buffalo High School, serves students who thrive in an alternative high school setting. Recognizing that there are many pathways for a student to succeed, staff offer personalized learning options in a family-like setting. Small class sizes support that individual focus, and students develop the skills to be responsible for their own learning plan while still enjoying the ability to participate in electives, arts and other BHS activities. Phoenix Learning Center instills confidence and emphasizes gratitude and joy in daily life while providing strong support and more opportunities than are typically available at other alternative schools in the state.
